The Alderville First Nation Black Oak Savanna (ABOS) and Tallgrass Prairie is a 162 acre site on the edge of the Oak Ridges Moraine, near the southern shores of Rice Lake. The site supports two types of endangered grassland habitats: tallgrass prairie and oak savanna. Why are these grassland ecosystems so important? Much like forests and wetlands, grassland habitats have decreased dramatically. Today, less than 3 % of these grasslands persist in Ontario and North America. Grasslands in Ontario that have survived are typically small, fragmented and highly degraded. The ABOS site is the largest intact tract of native grassland habitat left within the Rice Lake Plains ([www.ricelakeplains.ca](http://www.ricelakeplains.ca)) and plays a key role in the future restoration of this unique eco-region. ABOS offers tours to schools academics and other interest groups for a small fee used directly for habitat improvement efforts. We have Qualified ecologists, biologists and technicians who in co-operation with our partners and local knowledge- holders in support of hands-on and placed based learning experiences around a group's interests/focus staff ABOS. Water occupies a central role in culture and spirituality. For some Indigenous people in northern Saskatchewan, it also plays a central role in their economy.

In the 1920's, wild rice was brought to the northern plains of Saskatchewan. Indigenous people were hired to grow it, and before long the Cree and Chippeweyan in the region became experts at growing the swampy grains. *Wild Rice* follows the Lac La Ronge Indian Bands who are currently among the world's top growers and exporters for this product.
