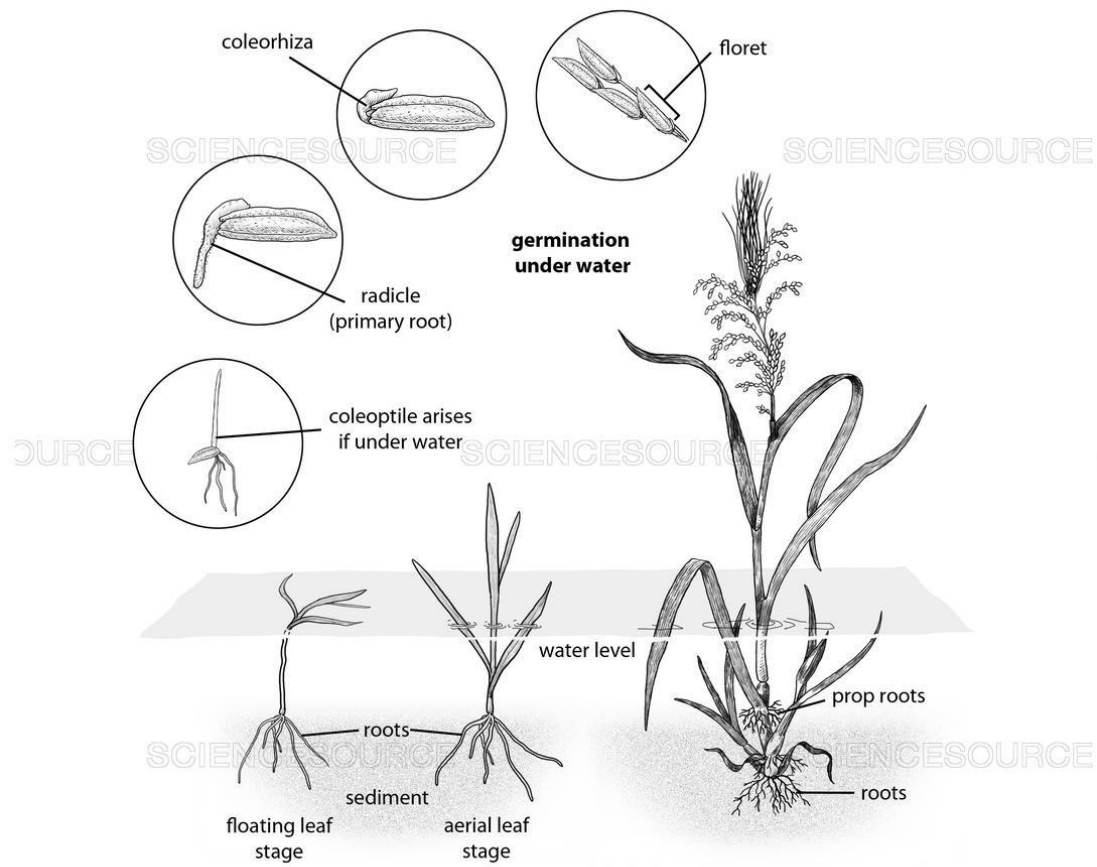

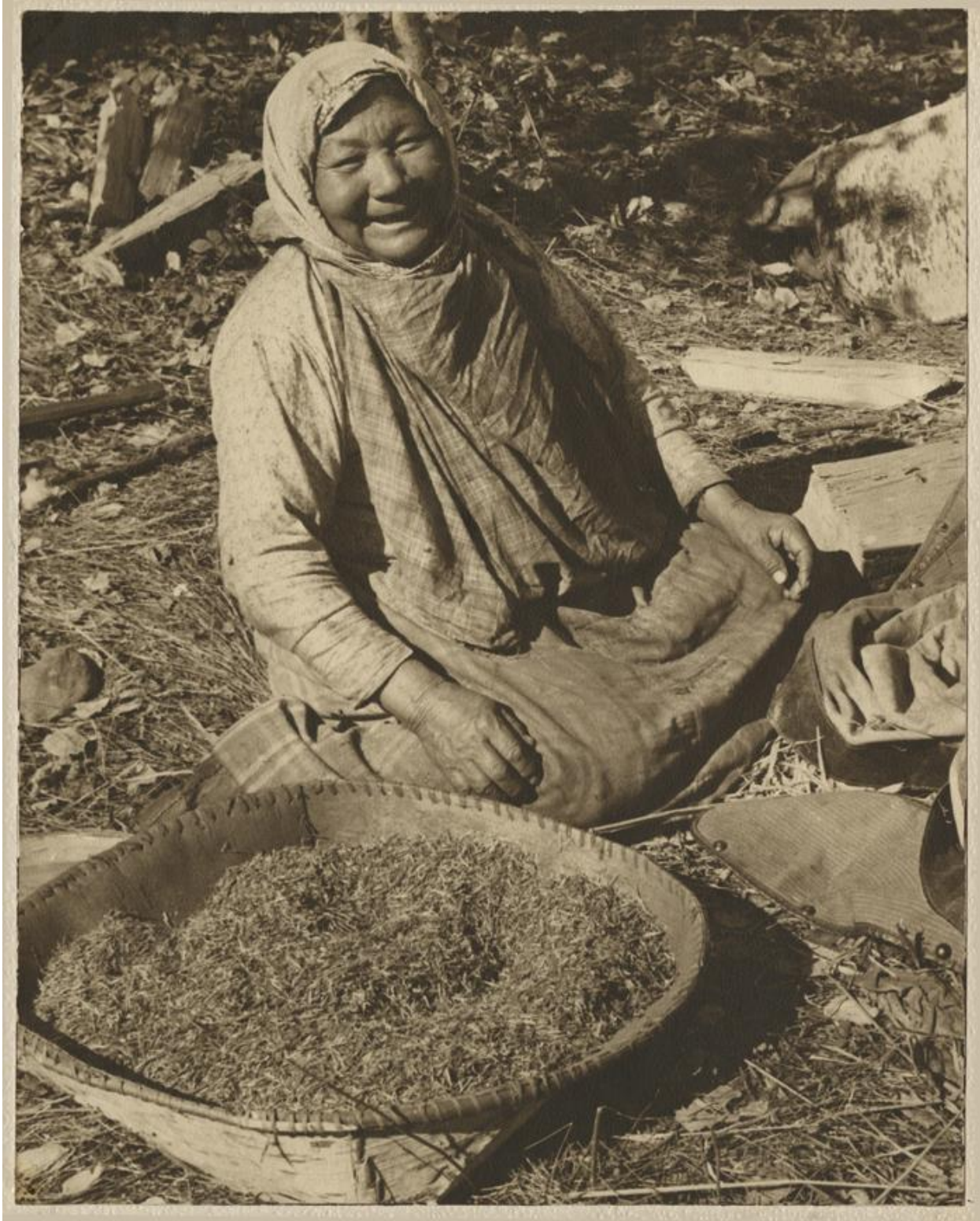

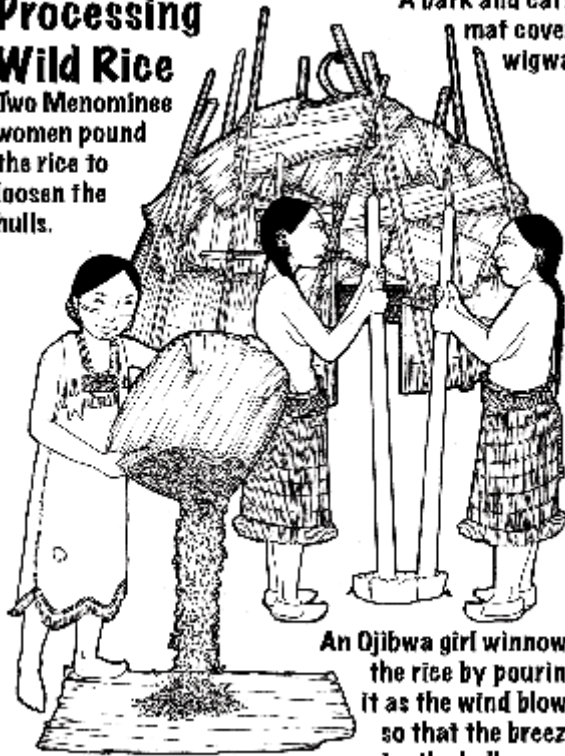

Smithsonian Museum of the American Indian: Cranberry Wild Rice Salad

1/2 cup pine nuts
1/4 cup pumpkin seeds
6 cups chicken stock
1 1/2 cup wild rice
1 carrot, cut into 1/2-inch-long matchsticks
3 tablespoons dried cranberries
1 Roma tomato, finely diced
4–5 scallions, finely chopped
3 bunches watercress

Vinaigrette:
3 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons canola oil
2 tablespoons honey
